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Paul Laurence Dunbar was an African American writer of the late 19th and early 20th centuries who wrote verse and short stories, many of which were written in black dialect despite the fact that he felt the

marketability of dialect poetry was demeaning. He was one of the first black writers to attempt to make a living from his writing, and certainly one of the first to gain national prominence. He was born June 27, 1872 in Dayton, Ohio and died February 9, 1906 in Dayton, Ohio.

Both of Mr. Dunbar's parents were former slaves; his father escaped to freedom in Canada and then returned to the U.S. to fight in the Civil War. The young Dunbar was the only black student in his Dayton high school, where he was the popular editor of the school paper. He published his first volume of poetry, *Oak and Ivy* (1893), at his own expense while working as an elevator operator and sold copies to his passengers to pay for the printing. ...



A vogue sprang up for his poems; he read them to audiences in the U.S. and England, and when he returned from abroad he was given a job in the reading room of the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C. (1897–98).

His first three novels—including *The Uncalled* (1898), which reflected his own spiritual problems—were about white characters. His last, sometimes considered his best, was *The Sport of the Gods* (1902), concerning an uprooted black family in the urban North.
